

How to make a copy of the Class Photo (on the cheap and easy)

This PDF contains 3 separate PDF's as attachments within it. Each of the attached PDF's will produce a different sized copy of the Class Photo. Page 2 shows illustrations for each of the Class Photo formats. You can select a 3-sheet, 5-sheet, and/or 10-sheet format. To select the appropriate format - open the attached PDF either by double clicking on the appropriate colored paper clip icon, or go to the attachments tab and select the appropriate attached PDF.

Once you have selected/opened the desired format PDF you just need to select "Print" and adjust the proper printer settings. You may have to select the proper paper type (Letter & probably borderless) , adjust Portrait/Landscape mode and find the appropriate margin and scaling factor. As these items differ between printers and PDF readers I can't give you hard answers to those questions. You will just have to play with the different settings till you get the desired results. The format PDF's have overlap between pages to aid in alignment and pasting or taping.

I recommend you initially place your printer in the Draft (not Normal or Best) print mode till you have found and set the appropriate printer settings. If opting for the 10-sheet format I recommend you select to print only 3 adjoining pages till you have found the appropriate settings. Good Luck - Have Fun - Hope your ink don't cost too much if you select the 10-sheet option. (Actually I got reasonable results staying in Draft mode)

3 sheets - Landscape - 30"x8" About actual photo size. Will need a magnifying glass to see those in back but easy to assemble with only 2 seams.

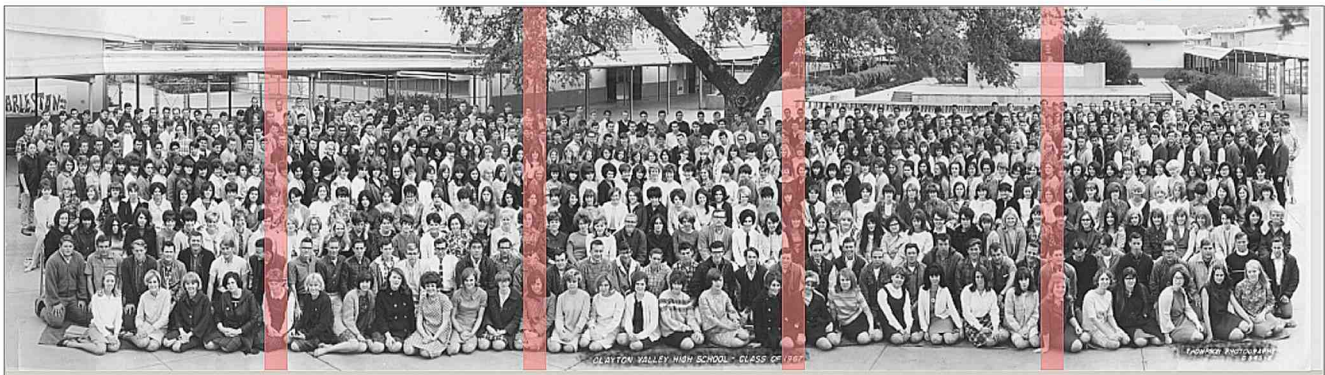

5 sheets - Portrait - 39"x11" May still need some help to recognize those in last 2 rows but again easy to assemble with only 4 seams.

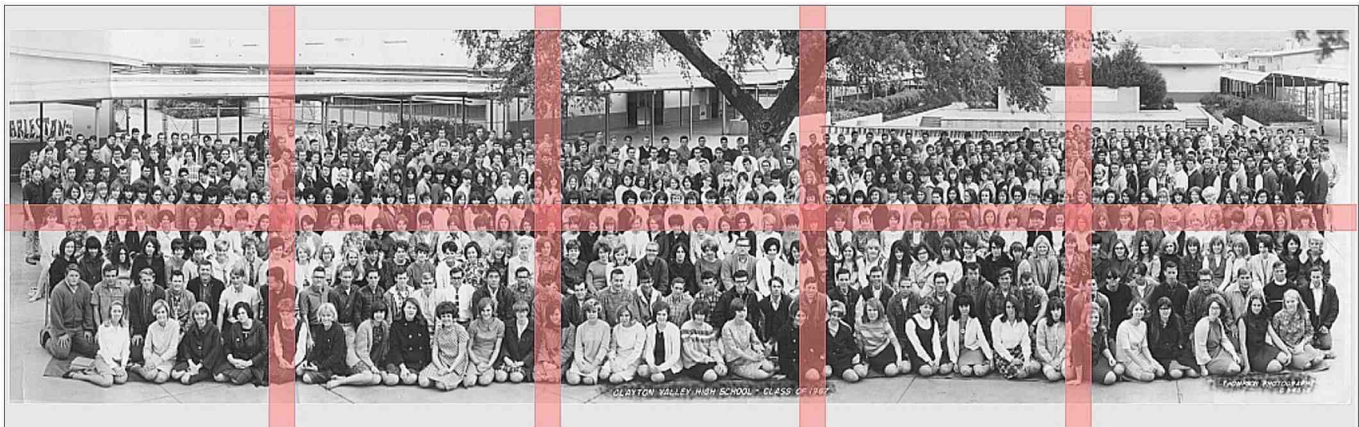
