PAT MIDDENDORF

COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP



Growing up in the Midwest the third oldest of twelve children at an early age Pat developed the nurturing skills that have led to her lifelong passion for dealing with people, especially young people.

Having a grandfather who was a standout out quarterback at Moorhead State University and high school teacher coach and athletic director in International Falls, MN, Pat had an early exposure to sports and to their positive impact on this country's youth.

While traversing the country in a series of corporate job transfers Pat managed to stay true to her passion, children and sports. While raising three children; sons Luke, Isaac and daughter Kendra and obtaining a master's degree in criminal justice, Pat began coaching her children's soccer teams as soon as they were able to join organized sports. While doing so she was president of their elementary school PTA, sat on the board of the local soccer league and also played soccer. Always involved always trying to improve.

The families move to Clayton in 1988 brought a new set of challenges and opportunities involving both her love of children and her love of sports. She received the first of her Teaching credentials in 1991, received subsequent credentials in Special Education and a Learning Handicap credential along with her Certified Athletic Administrator designation. The theme of students and athletics continued to grow.

After teaching at Parkside Elementary and El Dorado Middle School, she joined the teaching staff at Clayton Valley High School in 2002. By then she was already deeply entrenched in the soccer coaching world, serving on the board of the Mt Diablo Soccer Association and the CVHS JV soccer coach. She went on to become the head varsity soccer coach in 2003 and developed on of the strongest girl's high school soccer programs in the North Coast District. She was also appointed the CVHS athletic director in 2003 of which she managed 24 sports and 63 teams, along with her duties as head varsity soccer coach and Special Education instructor at the school.

Some of the projects involving CVHS athletics led by Pat include, the creation of Gonsalves Stadium. In 2004 it was the first artificial turf stadium in the Mt Diablo Unified School District. Pat's vision along with the generosity of the Gonsalves Family and many others lead to the first joint project driven by private funding and managed by volunteers in MDSU history. The construction of that stadium served as a model for other MDSU sponsored stadiums that we see today. Without Pat's vision and passion that stadium would not have been built.

In the midst of the "Great Recession" in 2008 MDSU decided they could no longer afford to fund high school sports in the district. Pat and a group of dedicated volunteers from other district schools founded the United Mt Diablo Athletic Foundation (UMDAF) to save high school sports in the district. With Pat acting as president of that organization a series of fundraisers, and the annual 6 high school 5K Race were able to not only secure the future of high school sports at MDUSD but watch them flourish.

Pat's contributions to CVHS have earned her numerous awards: 2010/2011/2014 CVHS staff member of the year award, 2010 City of Concord Mayors Community Service Award, 2008 MDUSD Coach of the Year award, 2008 CVHS Ray Schultz Award and the 2004 CA Senator Tom Torlakson Recognition Award, and now the CVHS Hall of Fame Award, the schools highest honor.

Since leaving Clayton Valley, Pat's passion for students, those less fortunate, and sports has not diminished. She was one of the leads in developing the MDES Playfield Project just recently completed. Pat served as one of the leads in Relay for Life for the American Cancer Society, was captain for Team Anu, helped bring back the Clayton Round Up, became a Neighborhood Watch Coordinator, and is on the leadership team for the Clayton Community Wide Emergency Network. Most recently she has completed extensive training to become a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA), volunteers who help some of our areas most troubled youth.

Along the way she has been a terrific wife, mother and grandmother to her family. Her contributions to Clayton Valley High School and Clayton Valley High School Athletics along with her commitment to building a better society make her a most deserving recipient of this award.

GEORGE SMYLIE



George grew up in Pittsburg, CA., and graduated from Pittsburg High School in 1960. His love of sports evolved at Pittsburg HS as an athlete playing football and basketball. He then played football and basketball at Diablo Valley College (DVC), and then went on to play football at Sacramento State University. George started coaching varsity football at Clayton Valley in 1969. He led 3 different teams in 3 different sports to 3 League Championships. George, Karen Johnson, and Roger Zino were the only head coaches to accomplish this feat.

George was a devoted, enthusiastic teacher and coach of both girls and boys at Clayton Valley. He gave unselfishly of his time and expertise to ensure that his students and athletes reached their potential. George was coaching football when the athletic program was in need of a head track coach and George took the job. When the JV girls' basketball team needed a coach George again stepped up to coach them. When the varsity girls coach had to resign because of health issues, George became the varsity coach.

George was honored for his dedication by the CVHS Student Council for his sponsorship of Crossfire Group (1969-1990). The Mt. Diablo School District Board recognized George for "Excellent Service & Dedication" as a coach and educator for 38 years. In 1990 at the CVHS Sports Banquet, coaches presented George with a plaque inscribed "Last of the Ugly Eagles".

"In the 70's George was one of the best defensive coaches in the area. He brought the "zot defense" from Sacramento State to CV. He was also an outstanding Head Coach at CV. I coached with him for years. After we prepared for a game George would always say "the hays in the barn" meaning we're ready. Well-deserved honor, CV Hall of Fame". Coach Tom Dimercurio

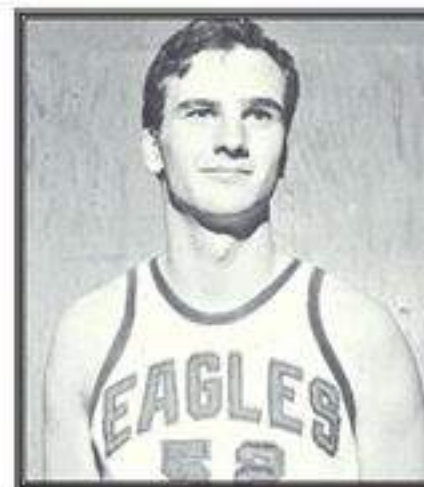

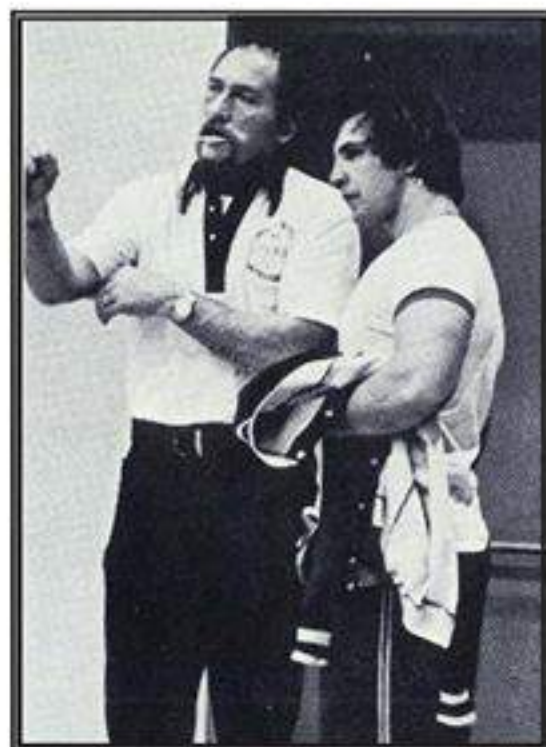

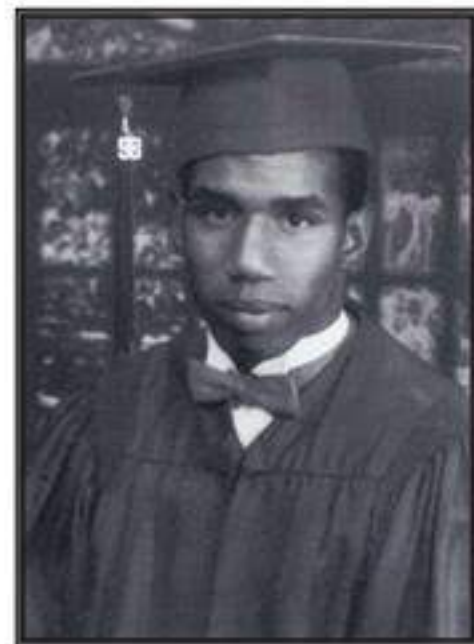

From the outset of the season, coach Bill Smith knew the 1978 wrestling team would have their work cut out for them trying to live up to the accomplishments of the 1977 team. All the '77 team did was win everything in sight including the California CIF State Championship. But this year's team was up to the challenge returning a complement of outstanding wrestlers and a group of motivated newcomers.

The 1978 team was a group of wrestlers who continued to improve throughout the season. The team was led by returning State runner-up Warren Turnage who lost a tough match in the 115-pound finals to a returning state champ in 1977. This year he would not be denied, moving up to the 123 lbs. class and claiming the state championship and finishing with a 34-0 record.

The season started with the team cruising through the practice dual match season and then going undefeated (8-0) in DVAL dual matches to win the regular season league crown. On the way there, the team posted strong finishes at four invitational tournaments. In December, Warren Turnage won the Tennyson Invitational and then a couple weeks later he was champion at the Mark Lance Memorial Invitational at College Park. He shared honors with Karl Boeger who took 1st place at the Lance tourney at 193 pounds and Ray Santucci who was the heavyweight champion winning his finals match up with an impressive 14-3 victory. In January, both Turnage and Boeger repeated their championship performances at the Mt. Diablo Invitational. At the 14th annual Del Valle Invitational, a tournament that Clayton Valley had competed in since 1964, the Eagle grapplers came away with two champions, Stan Bergum at 98 lbs. and Stan Scott at 114 lbs. Karl Boeger was runner-up. Warren Turnage was held out of this tournament due to injury.

When February rolls around it is time for wrestling's second season, the League, North Coast Section and State Championship tournaments. CVHS had won all three of these tournaments the year before and were determined to perform at the top level again. It was at the DVAL tournament that CV started to pull away from their competitors with an amazing ten place winners at the tournament. Champions included Ron Del Prado at 115 lbs., Warren Turnage at 123 lbs., Karl Boeger at 194 lbs. and Ray Santucci at heavyweight. Runner-ups included Lee Patrick, 130 lbs. and Bill Schmalzel at 157 lbs. Stan Scott, Stan Bergum and Terry Newberry all won their consolation finals to take third place. Rick Hanson rounded out the scoring with a 4th place at 178 lbs. This added up to a team total of 163 points, far out distancing runner-up College Park at 122 points.

The performance at league meant the CV would send nine wrestlers to the North Coast Section tournament, which represents over one hundred high school programs in the north state. Coach Smith had stated all week that winning this tournament for a second year in a row would be a tough act to follow, but low and behold the team again finished as NCS champions! As usual the team was led by Warren Turnage who won the 123-pound crown and Karl Boeger who was the 194-pound champion. Ron Del Prado came through with a 3rd place finish at 115 and Ray Santucci took 3rd place at heavyweight to round out the CVHS place winners. Clayton Valley scored ninety-two points and was the only DVAL school to win individual championships.

Clayton Valley's performance at North Coast landed them four entrants to the California State Championships that were held in San Diego. The State Championships is a mega tournament that represents approximately nine hundred high school programs, by far the largest state tourney in the USA. When it was all over, Turnage ended his career by winning the 123-pound state championship with an 8-6 victory in the finals. His points along with points score by the three other CV qualifiers allowed the team to finish in 7th place at State. Turnage finished his high school career with a four-year record of 160-11. His 160 careers wins were the most ever by a high school wrestler in USA wrestling history.

The 1999 Clayton Valley High School Boys Swimming and Diving Team was a remarkable team and one of the ALL TIME BEST at CVHS!

The 1999 Team was coached by Head Coaches Matt Chamberlain and Don Bluth. They finished 2nd (8-1) in the Bay Valley Athletic League dual meet competition before winning the North Coast Section Championship Team Title.

Contra Costa Times / Concord Transcript Staff writer Mike McGreehan wrote - When it comes to swimming, individual performances such as Mark Spitz's Record seven gold medals in the 1972 Olympics tend to stand out brightest, but swimming isn't all about individual glory. There is the team aspect as well. Both facets of swimming were clearly on display at the North Coast Section Swimming and Diving Championship Meet at Indian Valley College in Novato (May 21 - 22, 1999).

Clayton Valley High School Boys Team won the North Coast Championship with 231 points. Of course, a team title is nothing more than the sum of individual contributions and the Eagles had plenty of them. "It was a team effort from all of our year round swimmers, water polo players, summer league swimmers and our divers," said Eagles Head Coach Matt Chamberlain. "We're proud of everyone. This is the first time that Clayton Valley High School has won the North Coast Section Title for the Boys program and we're thrilled."

- Ben Chisholm was 10th in 200 Individual Medley (1:56.98 - 5th fastest School Time)
- Anders Nelson was 3rd in the 50 Freestyle (21.31 - School Record)
- Mike Gausman won the 100 Butterfly (50.32 - SPEEDO ALL AMERICAN FIRST TEAM, 5th fastest School Time)
- Jeff Scott was 13th in the 100 Butterfly (54.07 - 9th fastest School Time)
- Anders Nelson was 3rd in the 100 Freestyle (47.34 - 6th fastest School Time)
- Josh Scott finished 8th in the 500 Freestyle (4:46.36 - 4th fastest School Time)
- Mike Gavan was 23rd in the 500 Freestyle (5:05.05)
- Dennis Barraza, Alex Palmer, Chris Panza and Jeff Scott tied for 10th in the Consolation Final of the 200 Freestyle Relay (1:31.58 - 6th fastest School Time)

- Jeff Scott was 9th, winning the Consolation Final of the 100 Backstroke (55.37 - 6th fastest School Time)

McGreehan's article ended with a quote from Coach Matt Chamberlain "I'd like to dedicate this North Coast Pennant to former Clayton Valley High School Principal Ray Schultz, who died this year. He was always instrumental in supporting all athletes and all the programs at Clayton Valley High School."

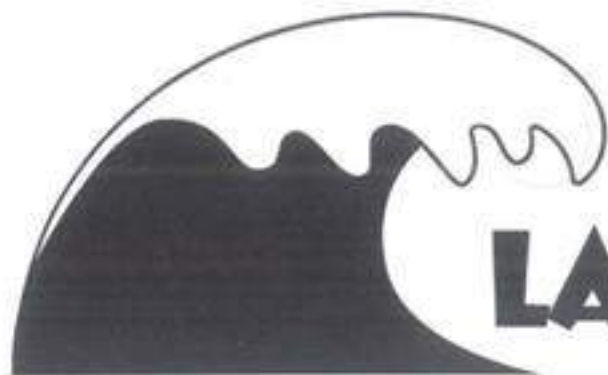
