

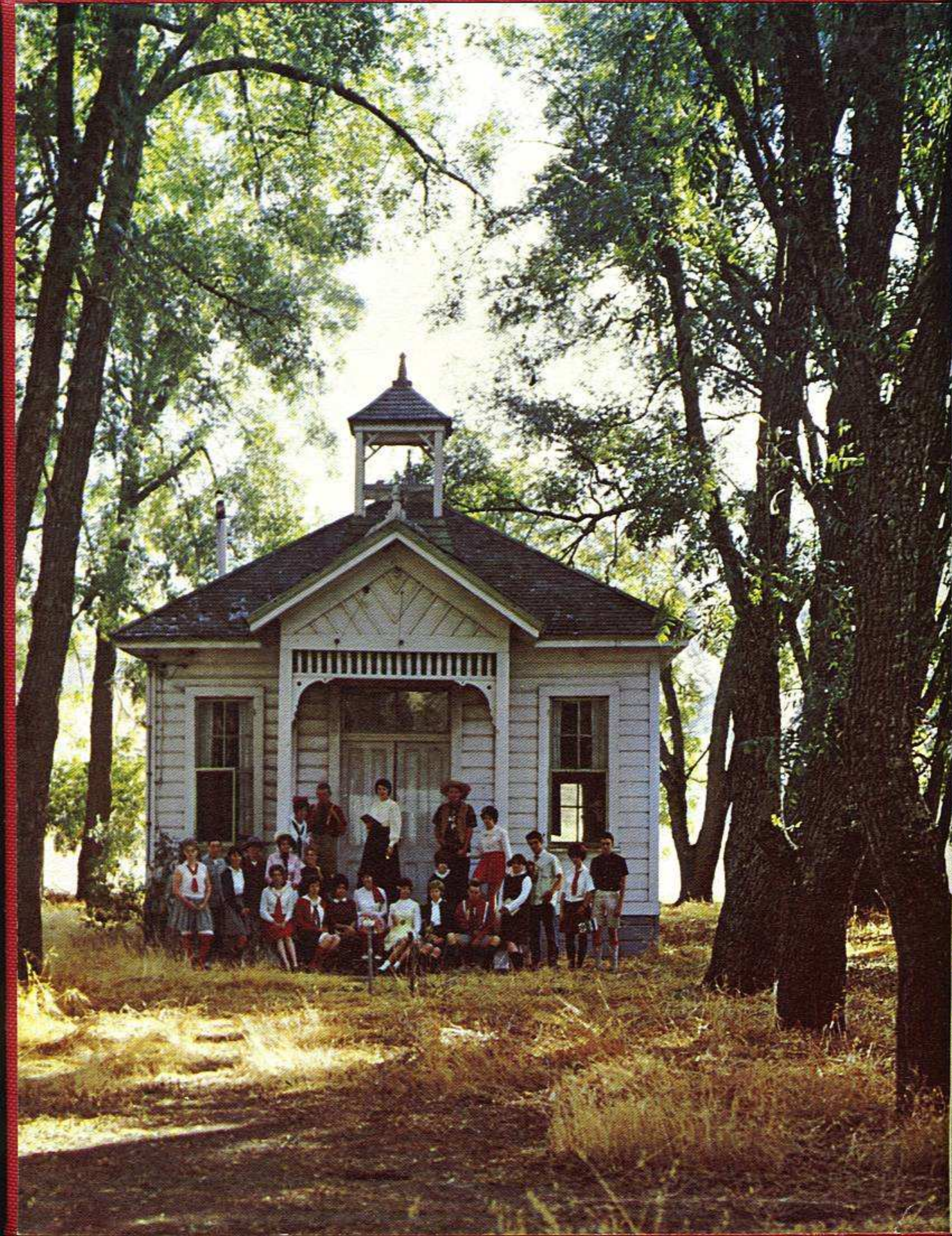

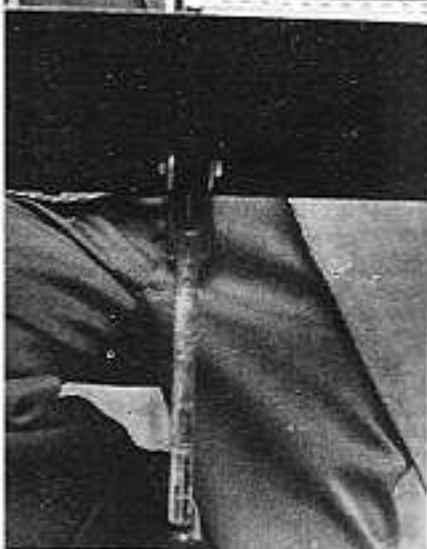
The Student Council

Each Wednesday morning at 8 o'clock, Clayton Valley's Student Council meets under the gavel of Student Body President Bill Shuey, to discuss problems and to decide upon issues pertinent to the school's welfare. This legislative body of seventeen members is elected by registered student voters. Four members are class presidents. The head yell leader, foreign exchange student, and officers of DVIC and CASC are honorary members.

The House of Representatives is the largest of the two Student Government bodies. It consists of one representative from each of the seventy-seven homerooms, and the Boys' and Girls' Representatives and is directed by Student Body Vice-President George Crouch.

This year's Student Government holds membership in the California Association of Student Councils (CASC) and DVIC. C.V. is well represented in these organizations with CASC treasurer, DVIC secretary, and DVIC president.

Among the issues, that Student Government has considered this year are the proposed Student Court, changes in the selection of the head yell leader, discussions on fringe students, cooperation with the administration, effective leadership and changes in the responsibilities of the House of Representatives.

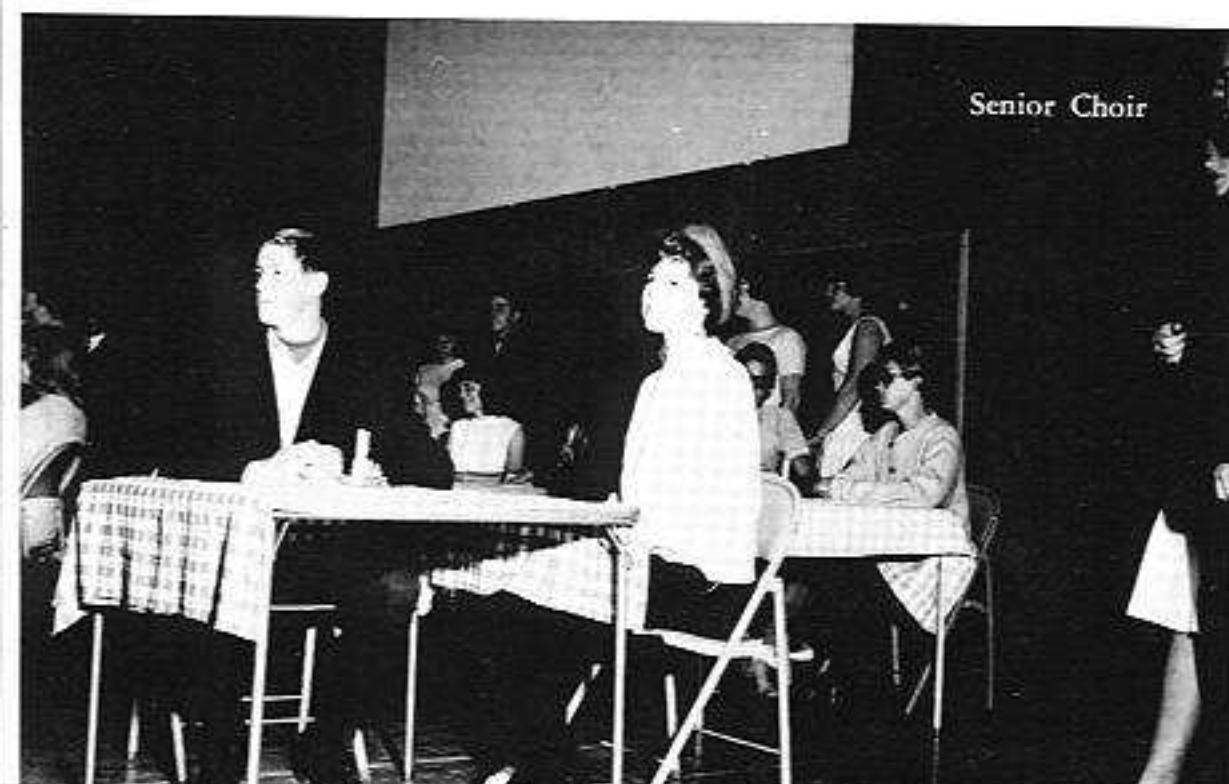

The solemnly religious service was led by Reverend Stanley Miller and Father Michael. Dr. Robert Christiansen delivered the address.

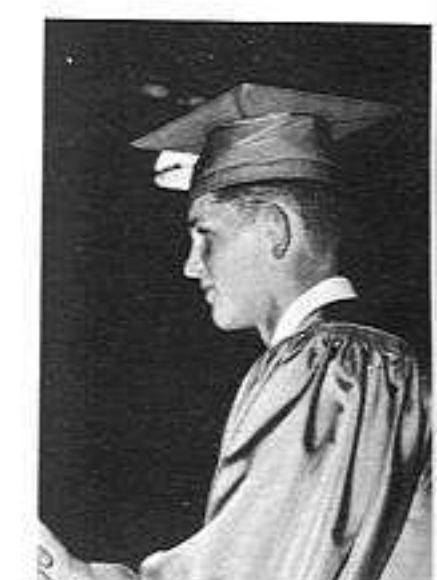
The Seniors were together as a group for the last time during commencement exercises, June 11.

And so, a World War II Naval Officer and native of Tulare in San Joaquin Valley, Dan Della became the first principal of Clayton Valley High School.

After earning a degree at the University of California, Mr. Della continued his education at Columbia University. During World War II he served as an engineering officer on a destroyer in the rolling Pacific.

In 1948, Mr. Della took the Peruvian team to the Olympics in London where they won eight and lost nine games, finishing ninth in the final Olympic standings.

An organization in which Principal Della is active is the Contra Costa County California Association of Secondary School Administrators of which he is Secretary-Treasurer. He has served as President of the Pleasant Hill Rotary Club and holds membership in Phi Delta Kappa, an educational honorary fraternity.

History Is a Foundation . . .

North latitude 37° 54' and west longitude 122° 03' set the geographical location of the village of Todos Santos, an 1828 land grant of 18,000 acres which became a town in 1869 and an incorporated city in 1905.

Renamed Concord in 1910, cattle were no longer free to roam once open streets and the barley and wheat fields began a slow decline because the town was expanding.

Concord's citizens now number close to 70,000. The cattle and fields of grain have been replaced by numerous tracts of duplicate homes with inviting and exotic names and several shopping centers. Concord's first school was erected in 1870 for the 36 children residing here. Now Concord has 20 elementary schools, five intermediate schools, four high schools, and one junior college. Saddled horses, buckboard wagons, dirt and gravel roads have been replaced by Impalas, Mustangs, and super highways.

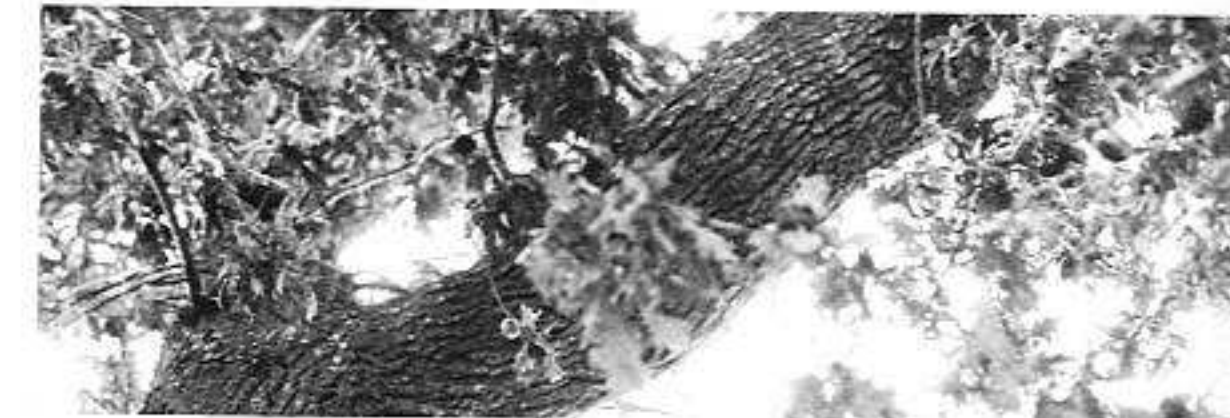
The village of Todos Santos and the City of Concord have one thing in common . . . the city plaza

is still the heart of the town as it was then. Community gathering were held in the plaza and on important occasions, even the governor of the state was present. Now Concord hosts such dignitaries as Pierre Salinger, Jayne Mansfield, Nelson Rockefeller, Mamie VanDoren, Barry Goldwater, Willy McCovey and President Johnson.

Out of this historic setting grew Clayton Valley High School. On land which was once farmed, there is now a school of steel and concrete. In 1910, Mt. Diablo High, the only secondary school in the area, graduated a class of 47 students. A half century later, Clayton Valley, one of six schools in the district, graduated 525 young people.

The buckboards, farms, wooden schools and wagon wheels of Concord's past are almost silent, yet the past is remembered as a foundation upon which 1964 rests.

Today we embrace the past with remembrance and the future with longing.



Graduation in 1910 (left) and in 1964 (above).

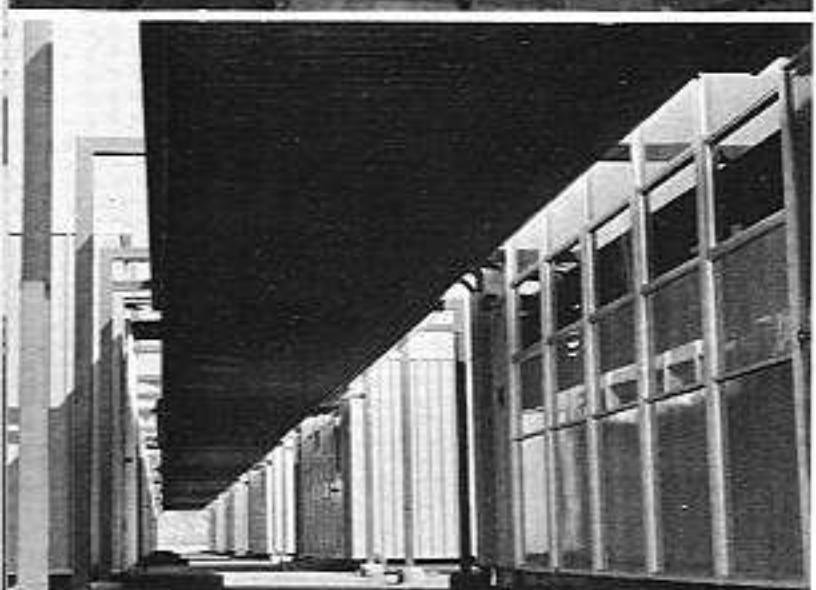
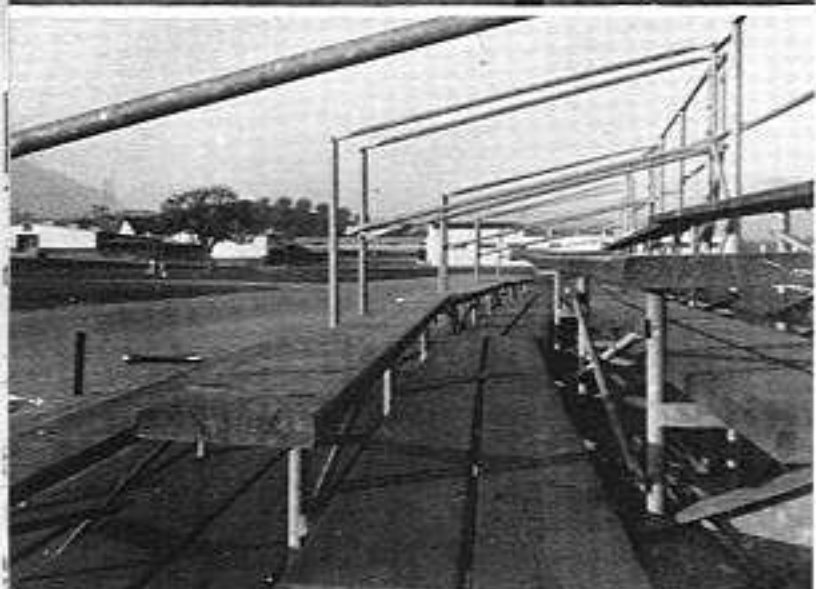
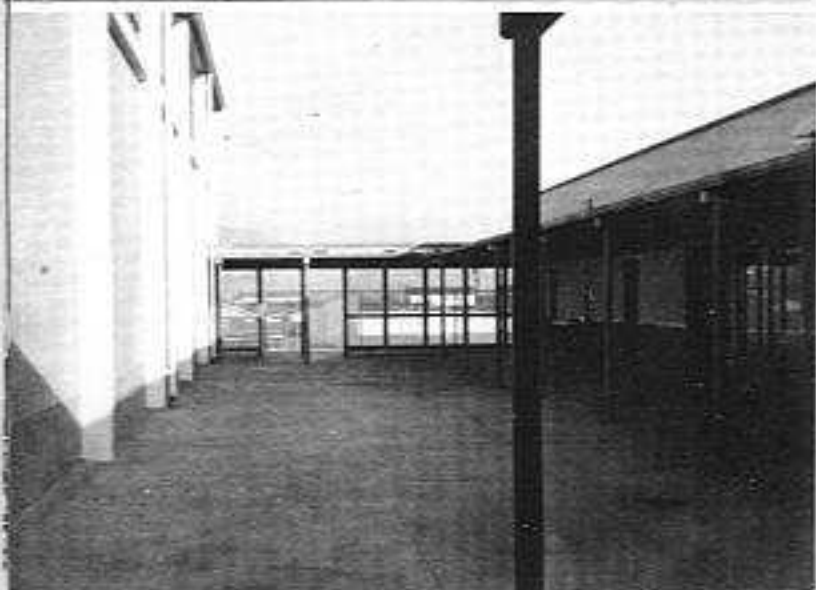
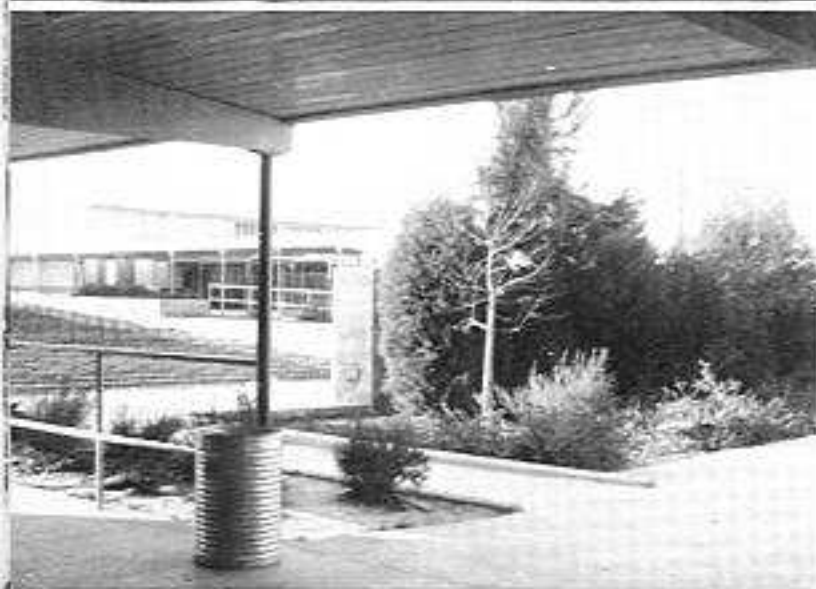
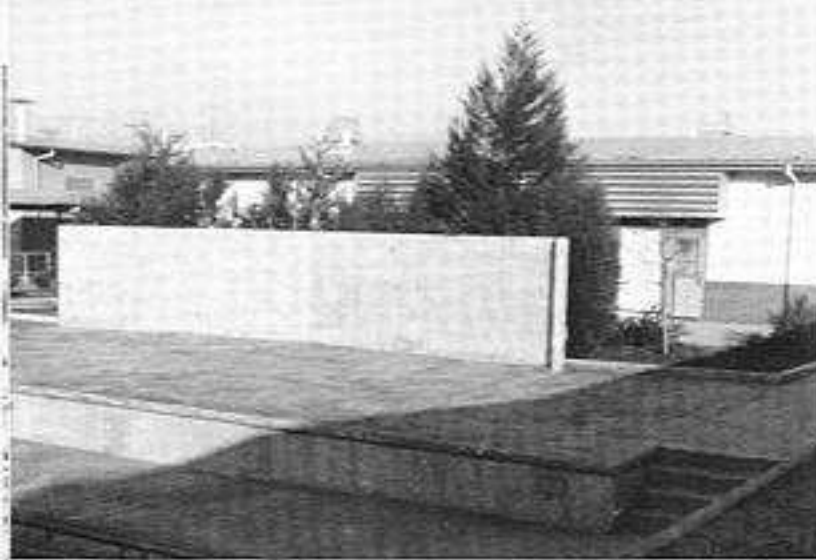

Clayton Valley's Choir

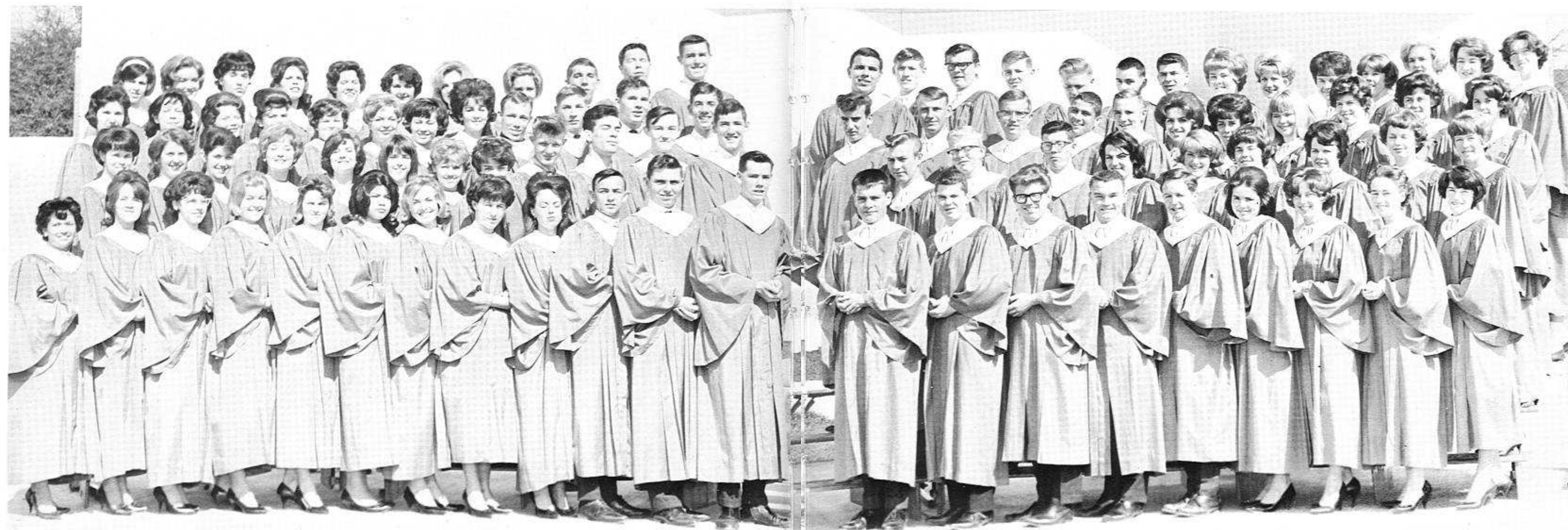

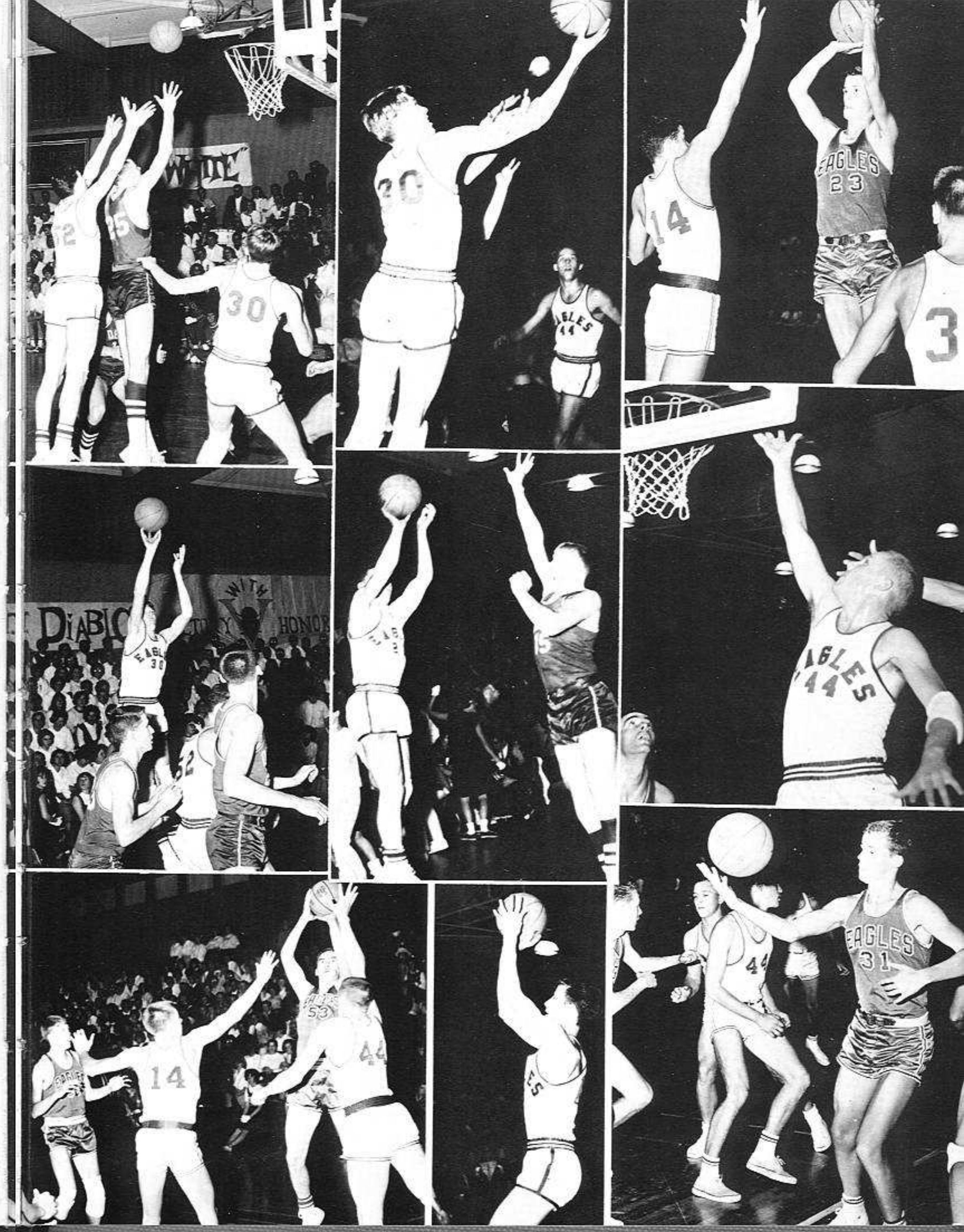
Junior Varsity and Freshman Basketball

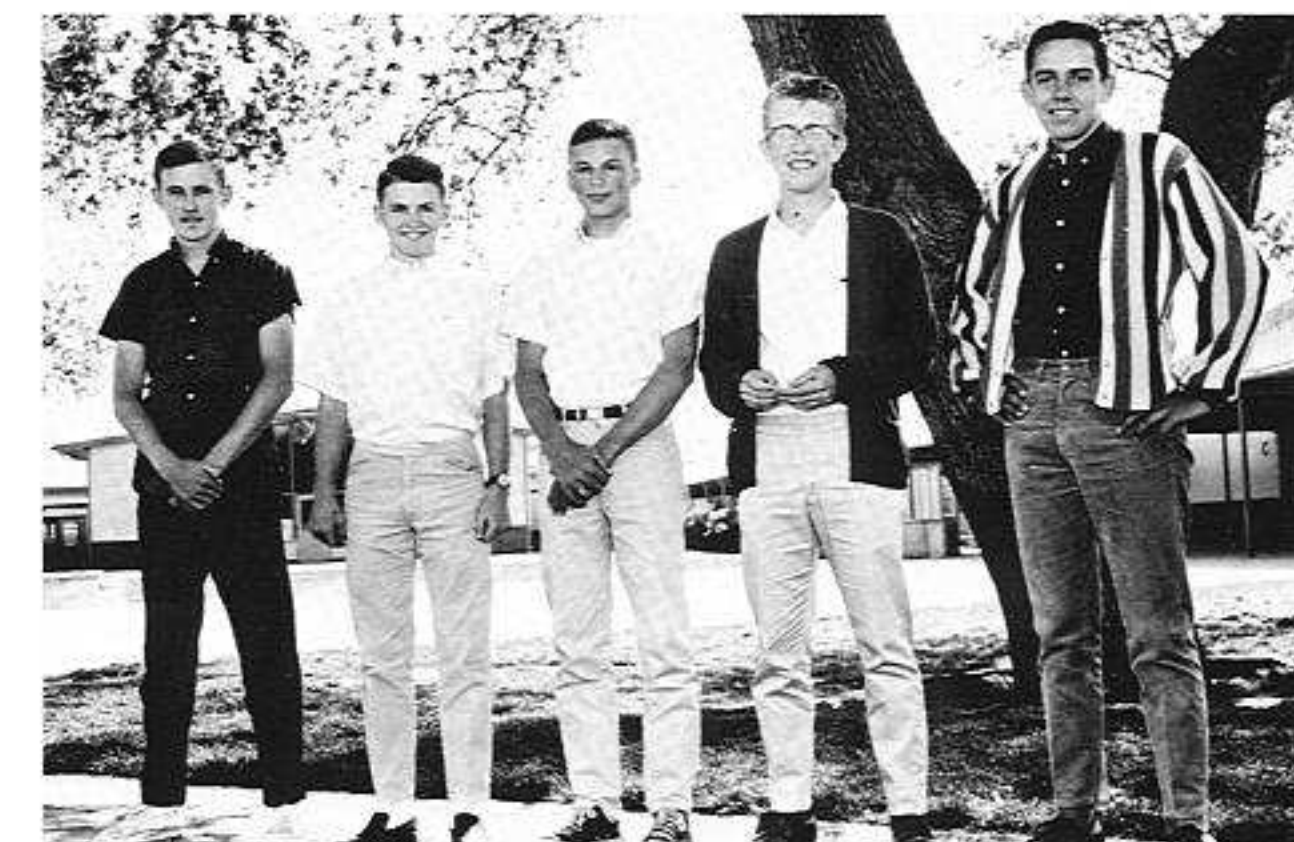

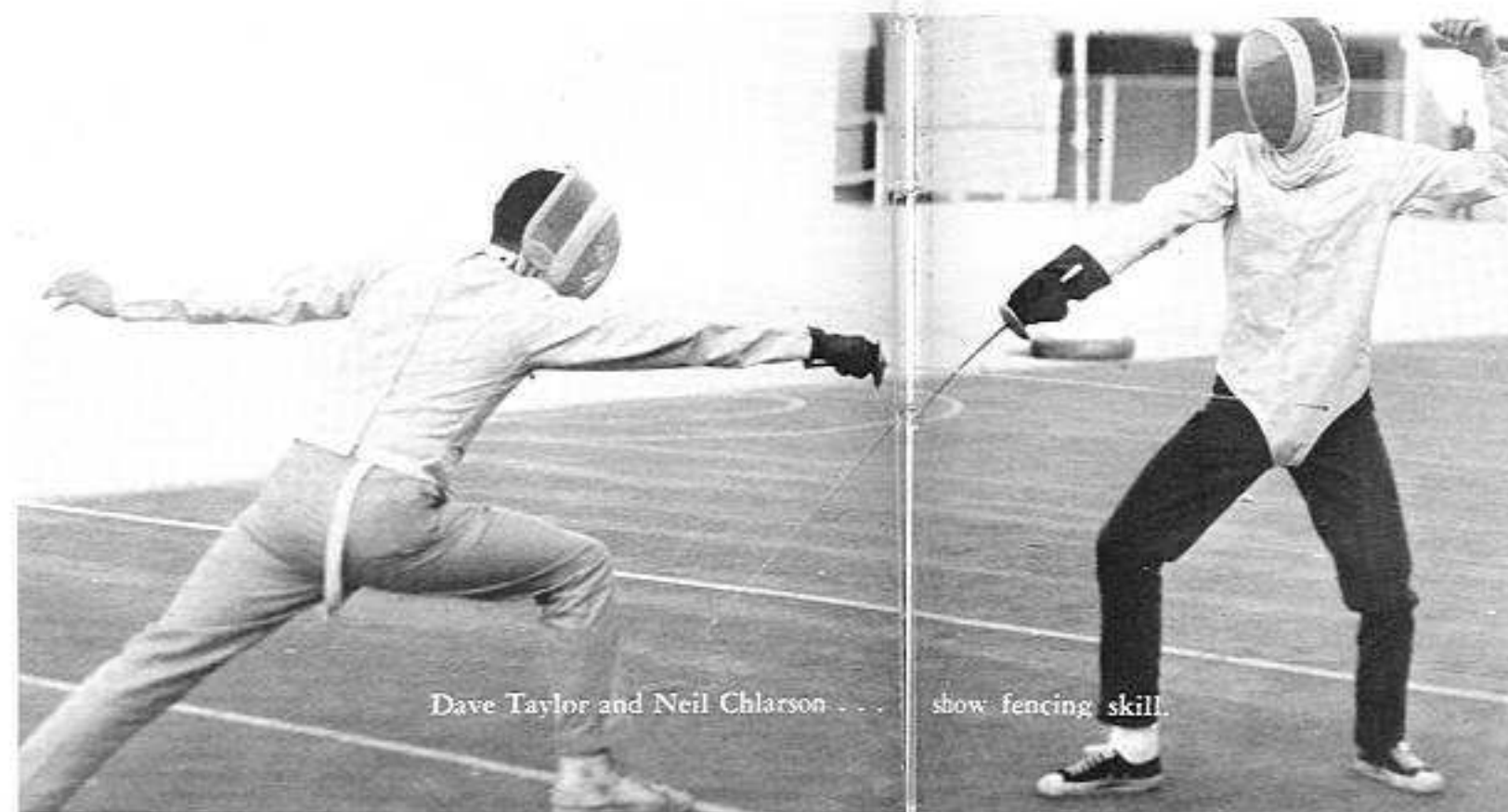
Fencing

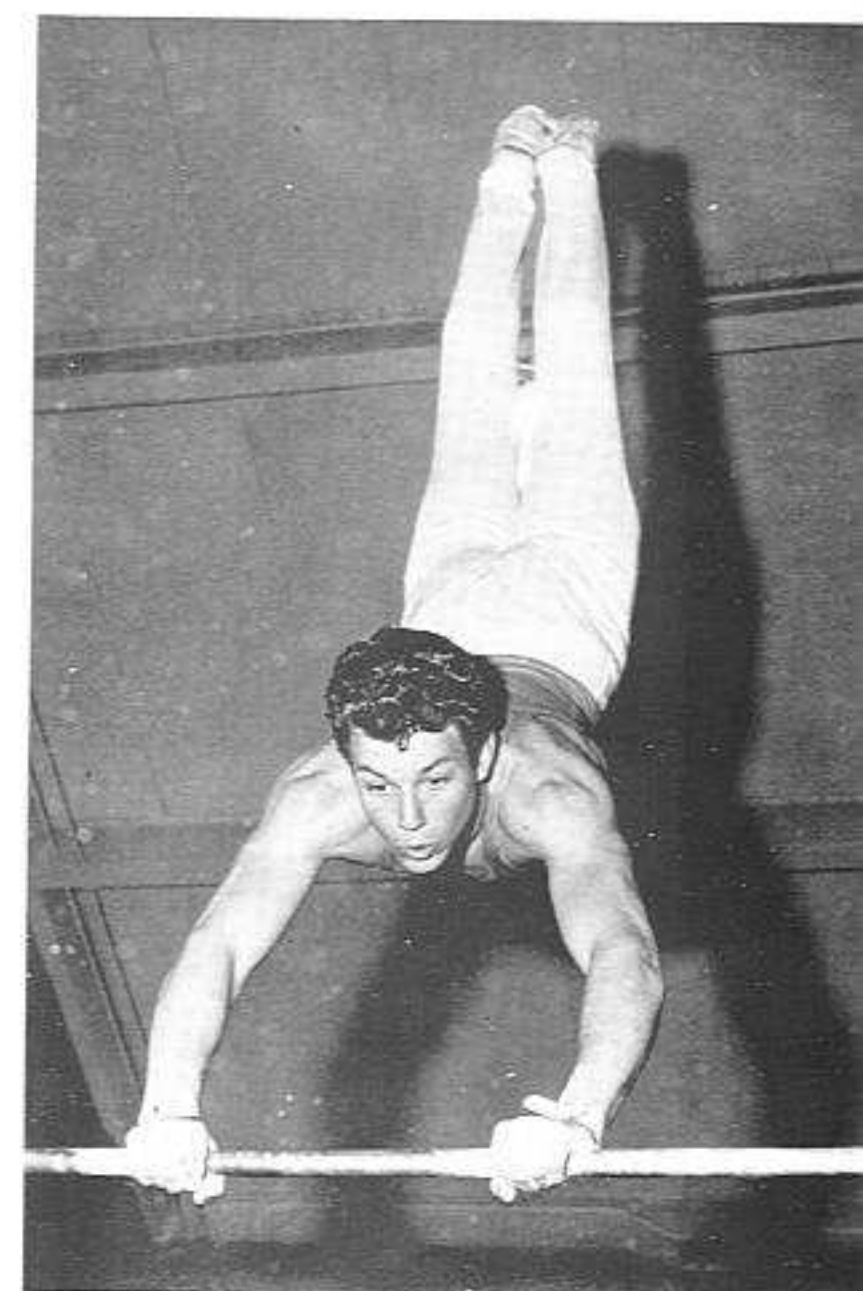
Gymnastics

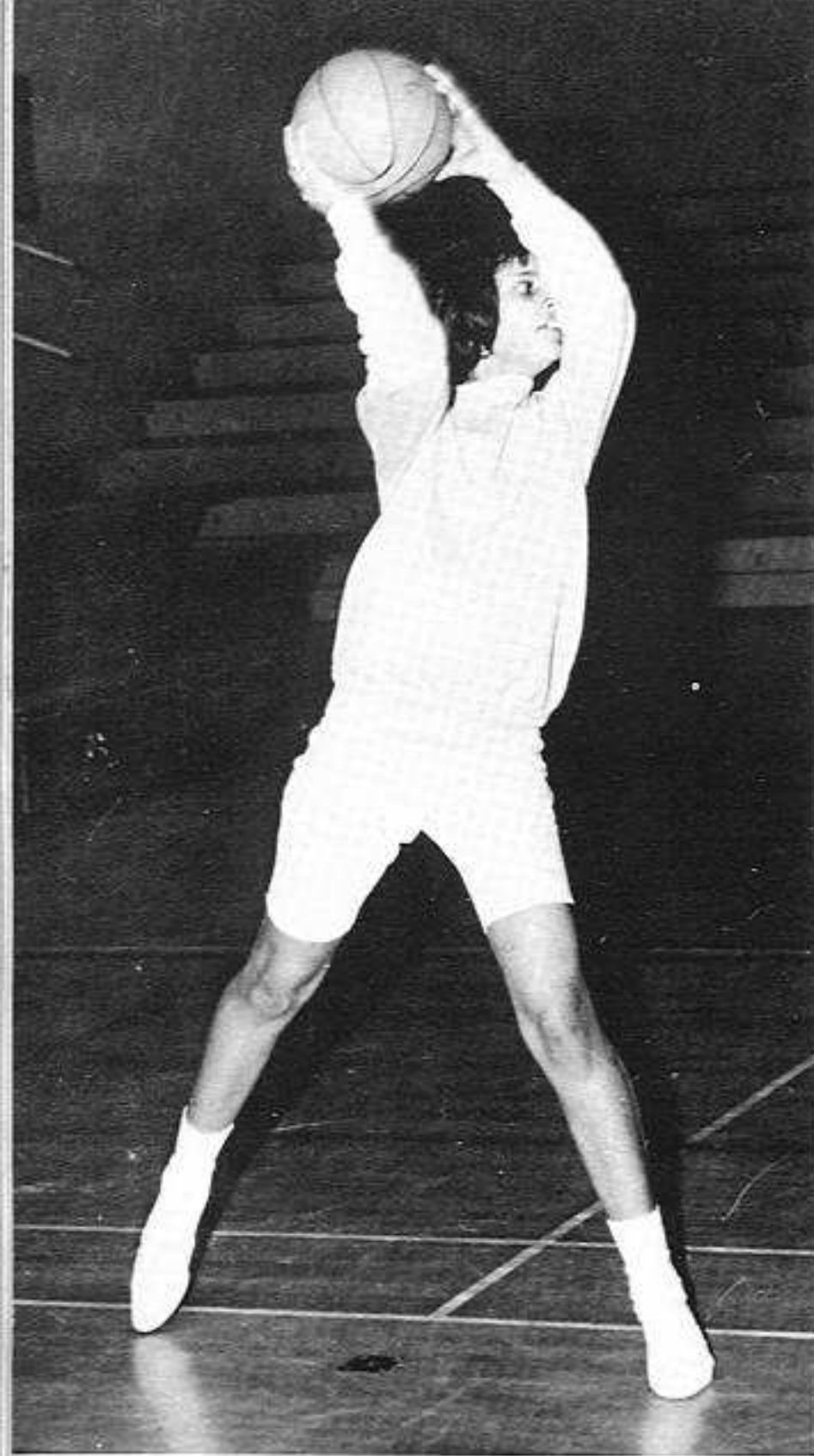

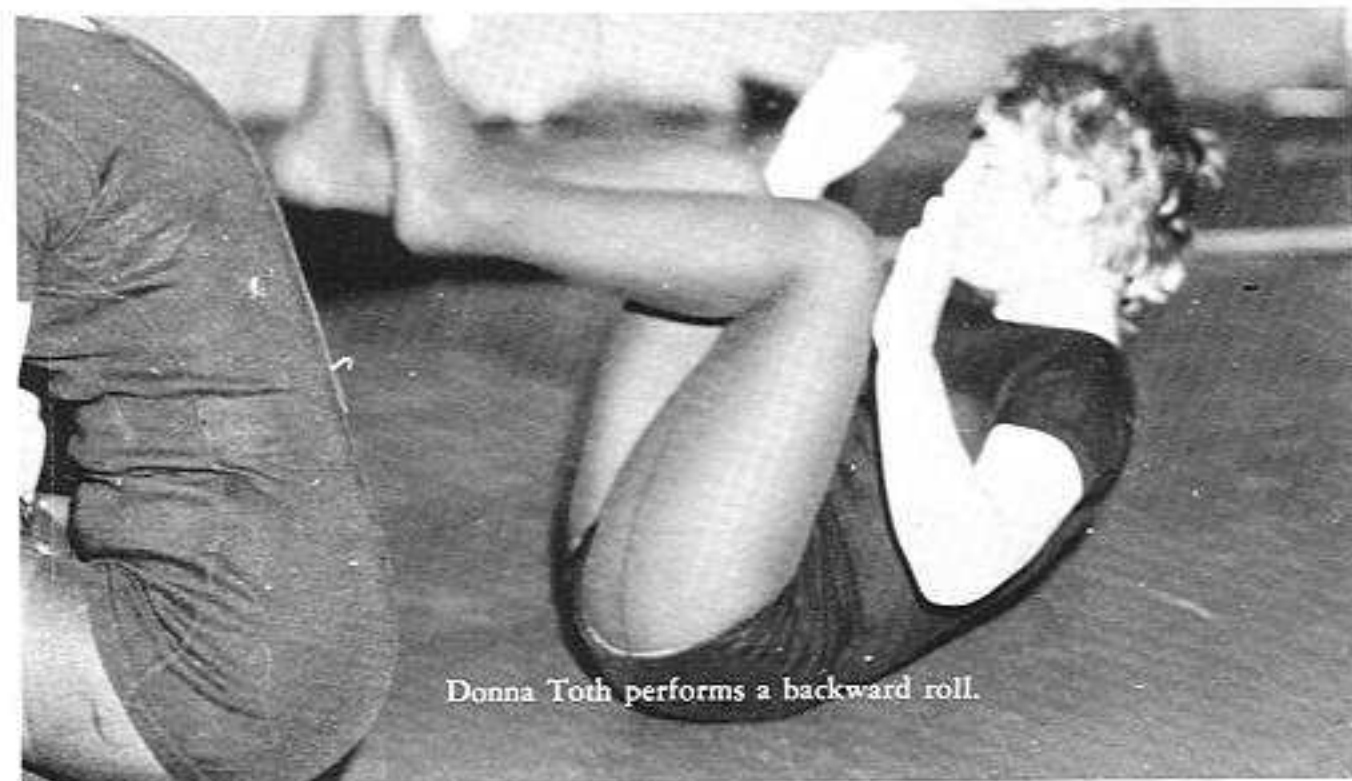

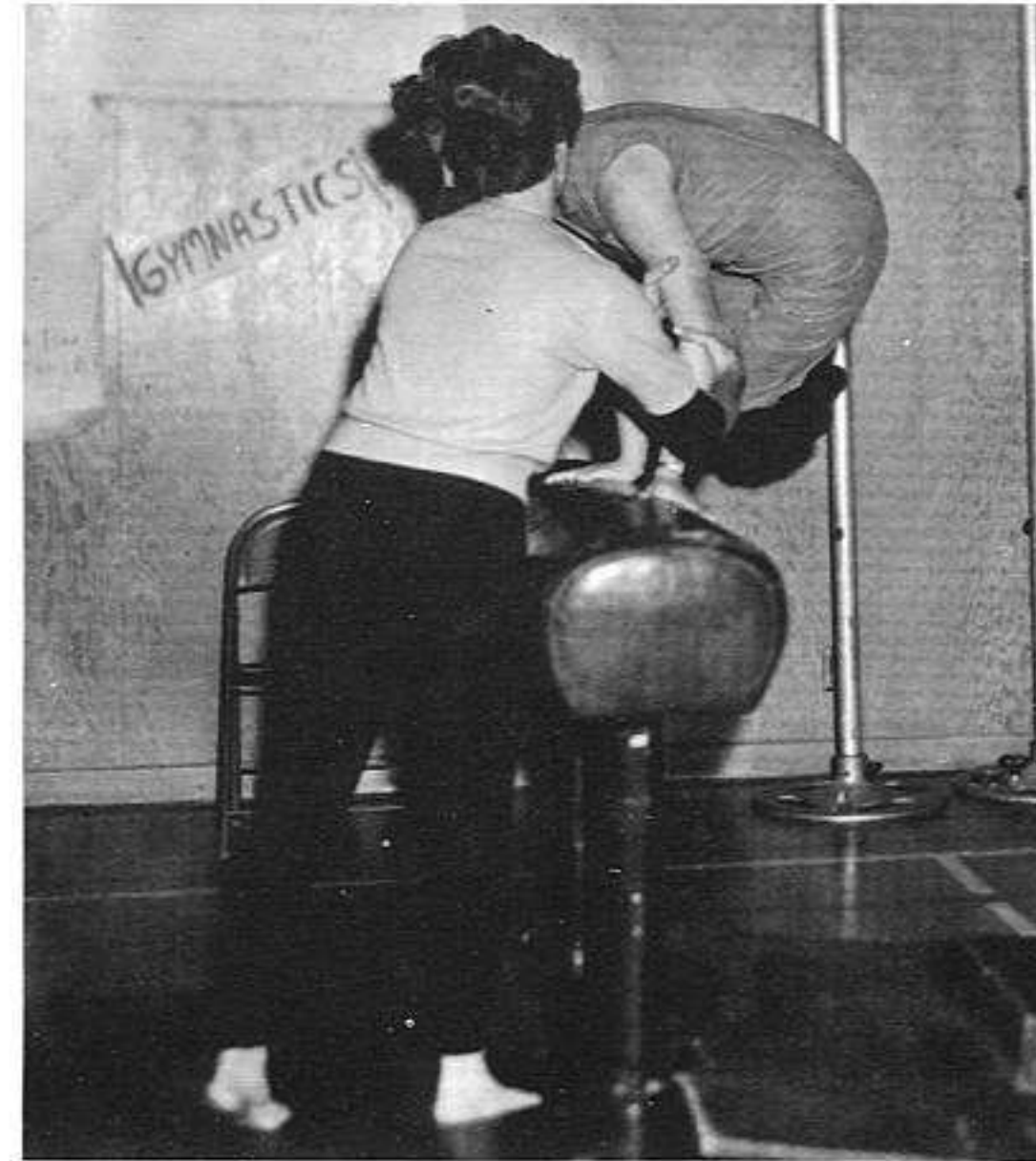
